Hello, I'm Tim your PCSO for Brasted. I patrol out of Sevenoaks Police Station, and start duty from as early as 7am and finish as late as 10pm on varying early and late shifts throughout the week and weekend. This greatly increases our availability in working to tackle local matters. I'm here to assist in dealing with your concerns about crime and anti-social behaviour. I'm also able to give you advice on how to protect your home, your property, and also yourself from crime.

I am also covering Chevening, Chipstead, Sundridge, Ide Hill, Westerham and Crockham Hill, and so even when carrying out my duties in these other areas, I'll be nearby or passing through maintaining a visible presence in Brasted.

Reports of crime will need to be made by calling 101 for non-emergencies or 999 for emergencies. The Kent Police website, as shown in the contact box below, is a great source of information and advice. You will be able to see the crime that has been reported, check any upcoming event or meeting dates, and even submit an enquiry to the local policing team. The 'Your Area' tab on the left side of the home page will lead you there. We have a Twitter page, also shown below, that is regularly updated with what's going on and what our officers are up to along with any particular results. Come and follow us to find out more!

At various times during the year we hold a variety of different community safety events including 'Safer Plates' where we're able to replace your car number plate screws to anti-tamper ones to assist in preventing the plates from being stolen. We also do property marking on bicycles and other valuables. These are all completely free of charge. Keep an eye on the Kent Police website for upcoming dates and locations.
